Overview of our rooms and facilities	All rooms are ensuite and are split over two floors into four units in total with nine residents living in each unit. Each unit has a communal lounge and kitchen/diner. Residents are encouraged to personalise their rooms and can bring their own furniture and belongings. Alternatively furniture can be provided. Communal gardens are on the ground floor.
Size of the home	Suitable to accommodate 36 residents
Brief description of staffing arrangements	We have eight carers on shift per day (two staff per unit). There is also a Team Leader each day working along with management throughout the week. An Activity Coordinator supports the residents with their mental and physical wellbeing. Our team of housekeepers, Chefs and maintenance staff support the day-to-day running of the home.
